

Teaching support

A KIRK wireless phone is like an invisible classroom assistant, unseen, and unheard until it is needed to support the teacher.



- Teachers are never isolated from their colleagues
- Children need never be left unattended
- Contact colleagues, office and caretaking staff from anywhere on campus
- No unauthorised use
- No vandalism
- Save time when looking for staff
- Get the convenience of a mobile phone with none of the ongoing costs



In the classroom or playground, the teacher is a remote and lone worker. No more so than when dealing with health & safety or security incidents. In these situations, the teacher has to rely on their own resources or leave the class unsupervised to call for assistance.

Left unattended some incidents might escalate beyond control and leaving the scene to call for assistance is often not an option.

Hoping to give teachers better access to support, some schools have installed telephones in the classroom or nearby in corridors. This has proved to be a poor solution and brings with it its own problems.

- Phones are exposed to unauthorised use and vandalism
- The teacher has still to leave the class unsupervised to call for assistance
- In the playground, corridors or between buildings the teacher is still on their own.

A wireless phone from KIRK overcomes these problems and brings other benefits. A wireless system from KIRK means that;

- Phones stay in the safekeeping of the teacher.
- The teacher can call for assistance and remain with the children in their care
- A telephone is at hand anywhere on the school campus (including playgrounds and playing fields)

- Teachers can make calls to pupils' families or carers and the external services without disturbing office staff or leaving their classroom.
- Teachers, office and caretaking staff can be contacted without sending messages via pupils or colleagues.

You do not need to change your telephone system to benefit from the KIRK phones. The system will retrofit to most existing telephone equipment.

KIRK phones have a talk time of 16 hours and a standby time of 150 hours so the teacher can keep the phone with them for the full school day without it needing a recharge.

The phones are tough but stylish. They are as well suited to the playground and science & technology classroom as they are to the admin office.

The phones have a 64 name and number memory and provide teaching staff with the extra support they need whether they are in the classroom, in the playground, or walking between classes
